March Meeting Minutes

Meeting Open Time: 7:04 PM at the Brookline American Legion Hall and via Zoom. 7 members were present. Bruce Richards from Manchester, NH, and a VFW member in Texas. There were 24 friends and family in attendance for the Patriots Pen and Voice of Democracy awards presentation.

A motion was made to suspend the meeting to conduct the awards ceremony. Awardees were presented with certificates and gift cards. The Post is very proud of these students and thank their families for raising such outstanding citizens.

The meeting was called back to order.

Reading of the Minutes: A motion was made by Bruce Moran to dispense with the reading of the February meeting minutes since they were published in the newsletter and sent to all members. Greg d'Arbonne seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Post Quartermaster's Report: The Quartermaster's Report was read. There were two deposits: one from National for dues for \$3.50 and the other was \$7.27 from Interest. Disbursements for the month were: \$225 to renew nonprofit status; \$819.40 to George Robinson for reimbursement of PP and VOD award costs; a renewal for \$32; \$300 to pay CPA to do Post taxes; and \$320 for Post expenses for a total of \$1,696.40. Bruce Moran made a motion that the Quartermaster's report be accepted as read, pending audit; seconded by Bob Smith, and unanimously approved.

- The Post received a thank you letter from Veterans Count for the Post's donation.
- The Post received a thank you note from Eugene Bourgeois's friend thanking the Post for supporting Eugene's funeral.

- Patriot's Pen Program: Next year's theme has been released by National.
- Voice of Democracy Program: Next year's theme has been released by National.
- Military Descendant Scholarship: Nothing to report.
- Service Officer: Greg d'Arbonne drove Mark
 Tigert to and from Dartmouth-Hitchcock
 Hospital in Lebanon this past week. Mark had
 a procedure that required him to stay
 overnight and not drive himself home. Mark is
 now resting at home..

Comrade or Family of Comrade in distress:

- Jeff Smith's wife, Cheryl, passed away the other day. Greg d'Arbonne made a motion that the Post make a \$100 donation in Cheryl's memory to Saint Jude's; seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved. Greg will send the link for the donation to Chris Lussier so Chris can make the donation for the Post. The members expressed their condolences to Jeff and their family.
- Kerry Spangler was not able to attend the meeting as he is recovering from recent dental work.

Membership: Nothing to report.

Remember National Home: Prayer was said for the National Home and residents.

General Orders: As distributed by the Department and District and posted on the Department website.

Old Business:

- Greg d'Arbonne discovered the bricks for the Global War on Terror pathway is being built in Manchester. Greg made a motion that the Post does not buy a brick; seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved.
- 990N for taxes: Chris Lussier stated that the income for the Post this past year exceeded the requirements for the short form 990N, so he filled out the long form with the CPA. Chris paid \$300 to a CPA for this year's taxes and the Post reimbursed him. Greg d'Arbonne made a motion that the Post pay the taxes and expenses for submitting the

taxes each year in perpetuity; seconded by Bruce Moran and unanimously approved.

- Memorial Day 2025:
 - Greg d'Arbonne will write a letter to the Select Board and the Hollis Town Band to notify them the Hollis VFW is running the ceremony this year and will provide them the details.
 - George Robinson will contact the local Scout Troops and ask for their support for the ceremony. He has already contacted the High School Honors Choir and asked if they can support the event.
 - Greg will provide a podium.
 - Chris Lussier will provide the PA system.
 - Chris and Bruce Moran will provide the "Battlefield Cross" items.
 - Chris Lussier will ask Reverend Rasmussen to give the Invocation.
 - The Post needs to advertise this event in the Hollis-Brookline Rotary online newspaper and Facebook.
 - The Post needs to ask the Rotary about the geraniums that go to each cemetery.
- Chris stated he will look at more durable flags that can be placed at the Beth Abraham Cemetery as the wind from the area tears the graveside flags more there than at other cemeteries in Town.

New Business:

- The Veterans with the 8th Graders at the Hollis-Brookline Middle School will be on 4 April from 9:15 to 12:15. Lunch will be served. All are invited.
- The Post will present the check to the High School Civics Class on Wednesday after the breakfast.
- The Brookline American Legion Flag Retirement Ceremony will be 21 June at 10 AM.
- George Robinson stated that with the Nation's 250th Birthday coming up next year, the Post should purchase banners celebrating this event and place them at the major crossroads in both Towns, a total of 8 banners. George

- will investigate what needs to be done and permissions that are needed.
- At the next Post meeting, elections for Post Officers will be held. All Officers stated they would be willing to stay in their position for another year.

Good of the Order:

 Andy Seremeth stated that the Town of Hollis Cemetery Commission is looking for grave markers that were sent to be cleaned years ago. He said they will need to order more.

- Chris Lussier will provide Andy with the details to order the ones the Post uses for members who have departed.
- Chris Lussier stated his dog, Bandit, passed away. Chris and his wife, Deb, donated Bandit's toys, leashes, bedding, etc. to Operation Delta Dog.

Closing: The meeting adjourned at 8:17 PM. The next meeting is 7:00 PM, Sunday, 20 April at the Brookline American Legion Hall, Brookline, NH and by Zoom.

families! This momentous event was not just a celebration; it was a heartfelt acknowledgment of the unwavering commitment to honoring our veterans and their sacrifices.


